## (3) COURSE CONTENT

## **PURPOSE**

The purpose of the course is to train students in the theories (e.g. person-centered, Behavioral, Cognitive-Behavioral) and practice the techniques and skills of interpersonal communication (e.g. feedback, repetition, paraphrasing, mirroring) required to apply counseling to individuals and various groups of patients or vulnerable groups (e.g. people with disabilities). The students will also learn cross-cultural diagnosis and counseling of refugees and immigrants and counseling in the health field (eg communicating with patients and their families, and breaking bad news). Finally, they will learn to recognize the challenges of practicing their profession (eg, burnout, secondary stress, and compassion fatigue) and apply techniques and methods to deal with the symptoms they may experience.
