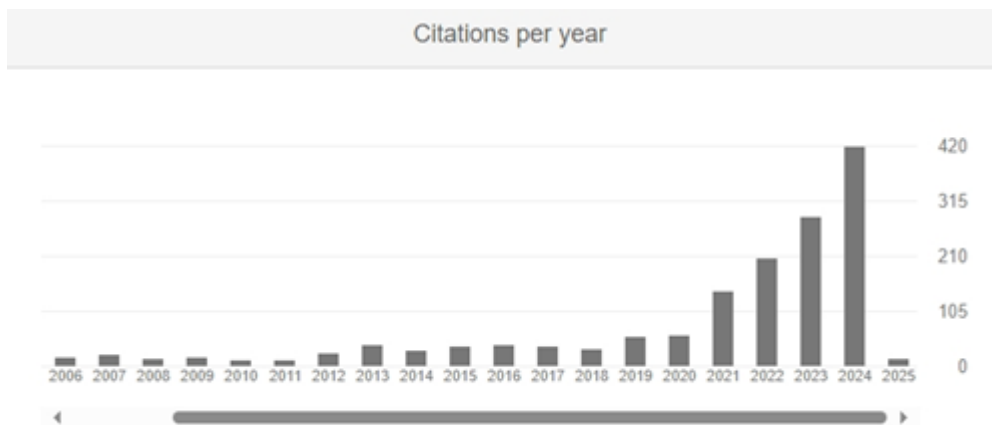

SHORT BIONOTE

Sofia Koukouli is Associate Professor of Social Policy at the Department of Social Work of the Hellenic Mediterranean University (ELMEPA) and Dean of the School of Health Sciences. She studied Sociology and Political Science in France (Paris X-Nanterre University). She continued her postgraduate studies in Political Science in the USA (New York University) and completed her PhD thesis at the Medical School of the University of Crete in the Department of Social Medicine. She teaches ‘social policy’ courses at the undergraduate level (such as social policy, family policy, health and social care policy), while she has also taught in three postgraduate programs. She was the scientific director of two funded research programs (Leonardo-Transfer of Innovation and Archimedes III) and has participated/is participating in various research programs related to her field of study either as a principal investigator or as a member of the research team. Her research interests focus on social policy issues for vulnerable groups with an emphasis on needs assessment for health and social care services, the quality of these services, as well as family policy issues. She has also held administrative positions of responsibility for a number of years, most notably that of Head of the Department of Social Work and most recently Dean of the Department of Social Work, while she has participated either as a member or as a coordinator in various School and University committees.
